FAQ - ELECTIONS

SOUTHSHORE METRO DISTRICT

In response to the community member feedback, the Resident Board is issuing FAQs intended to provide insight on our community's Metro District.

ELECTIONS - FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Recently residents have asked about metro district elections. This is intended to provide information regarding metro district elections. Metro districts follow state election laws which adds complexities not seen in other organizations such as a homeowners association.

When are board member elections?

Elections are held in May on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in odd numbered years. The next metro district board elections will occur in May 2025.

How many directors on the Southshore Metro District?

The metro district has 5 directors.

How long does a directors serve?

Directors serve a 4 year staggered term. The terms are staggered to ensure continuity.

How are vacancies filled and how long are their terms?

Appointment of new directors is at the discretion of the Board. The individual appointment has to meet the same criteria as an elected board member. The appointee will serve until the next election, at which time, the vacancy shall be filled by election for any remaining unexpired term.

Who is qualified to run for the district board?

Colorado law allows for any eligible elector to run for the district board. Eligible elector is defined as a Colorado registered voter and is a resident of the metro district.

Are director paid?

Colorado laws allows directors to be paid. After the May 2020 election, the resident directors voted to end the practice of being paid.

How are elections conducted?

All eligible electors receive a ballot in the mail.
